- The House at the Farm project is still in the works. We have applied for a grant and we are waiting to hear back on that.
- We are going to be doing a fee study for our entire Department.

ITEM DESCRIPTION:

Monthly Highlights:

- **Community Agriculture as Essential Infrastructure** – We hosted the two meetings with community leaders to discuss ways to increase community-based local food for those in need. During the June 16th meeting, the idea for Homegrown Harvest was developed, and the following week the city's second food donation program was launched. Modeled after the Grow-A-Row program, but leveraging backyards as the growing space, this program brings together residents, NFCC, and the city to bring fresh vegetables and herbs to the food pantry. Our goal is to have 30 households join the program. After one week of registration, we have 10 people signed up to grow.
- **Fall Garden Starts** – The seedlings for the fall/winter gardens are already starting to sprout in the germination room. Grower seedling pick up starts on August 28th and runs through September 7th.
- **Old Rucker Farm House Construction**
