Memorandum of Understanding

This document shall serve as a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) by and between the Ed Isakson/Alpharetta YMCA (a branch of the YMCA of Metropolitan Atlanta, Inc.), and the City of Alpharetta Parks and Recreation Department (a Department within the City of Alpharetta). The purpose of this MOU is to set-forth the general understanding and conditions under which the Ed Isakson/Alpharetta branch YMCA (YMCA) shall provide wellness programming in the form of Group Exercise classes to the general public at local parks and/or facilities owned by the City of Alpharetta (City).

The Ed Isakson/Alpharetta branch YMCA

1. At the request of the City of Alpharetta Parks and Recreation Department, the Ed Isakson/Alpharetta branch YMCA has agreed to initially provide two group exercise classes per week for the general public at two Alpharetta City Parks. As such, the YMCA has agreed to provide said classes free of charge. Each class will be staffed by two YMCA employees including one instructor certified to teach the class format offered.
2. The YMCA will ask participants to pre-register for said class on its website, collecting basic contact information and providing a copy of the required class waiver of liability. Participants who show-up day of class will be permitted to participate, but must provide basic contact information and sign a waiver of liability on-site.
3. The YMCA will have, on-hand, a variety of promotional material should class participants inquire about YMCA membership, programs and services. Logos of both the City and the YMCA shall be utilized in all promotion. The Y will not overtly recruit participants as YMCA members, although Y staff will explain the benefits of a YMCA membership in general terms. No membership, program, or activity fees will be exchanged without the prior approval from the Director of Alpharetta Parks and Recreation.
4. Class participants shall be made aware of proper attire and any equipment needed for said class. This information shall be made available on the YMCA website, and any links or flyers provided to the City for promotional purposes. The YMCA and the City may, at their discretion and for the convenience of participants, provide some or all of the equipment for a particular class.
5. The YMCA will provide the City a Certificate of Insurance, naming the City as additional insured.

The City of Alpharetta Parks and Recreation Department

1. The City shall agree to promote said classes to the general public of the City website, through promotional flyers and links, and by other methods agreed upon by both parties. Logos of both the City and the YMCA shall be utilized in all promotion.
2. The City shall ensure that class venues are reasonably clean and clear of debris or other obstacles that may compromise the safety and utilization of said venue.

3. The City may request additional classes of same or different formats, or request a change in the format of existing classes. Should classes be added to the initial 2 per week, the Y and the City will work to establish a cost, if any, for said classes.

The YMCA and the City are desirous of exploring additional ways in which to collaborate in serving the wellness needs of the citizens of Alpharetta. As such, this MOU may be amended, as necessary, from time to time, to include additional programs, events and activities as necessary.

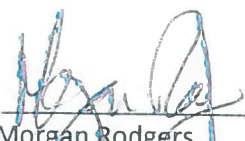
Either Party may, at its sole discretion and without cause, terminate this MOU with 30-days' notice.

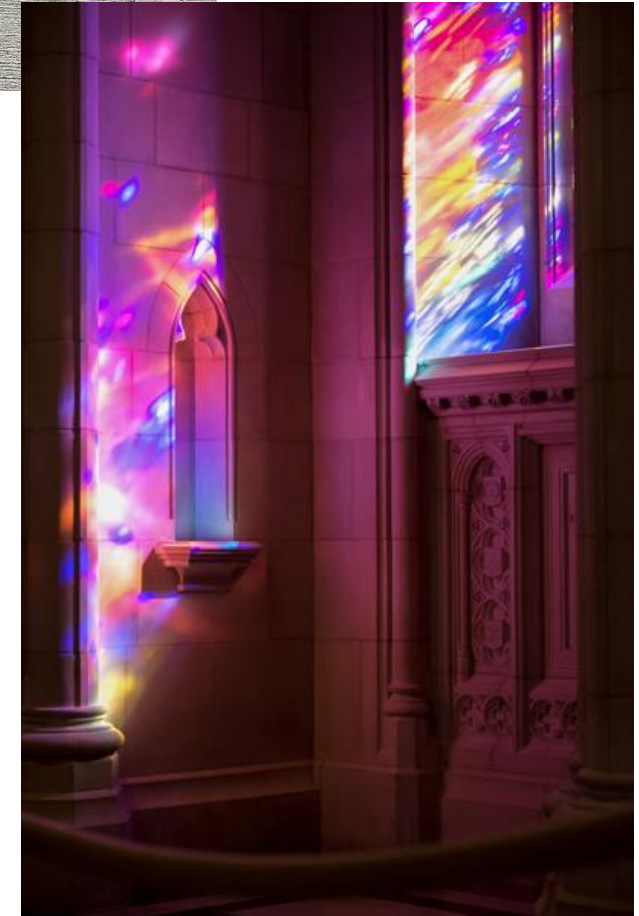
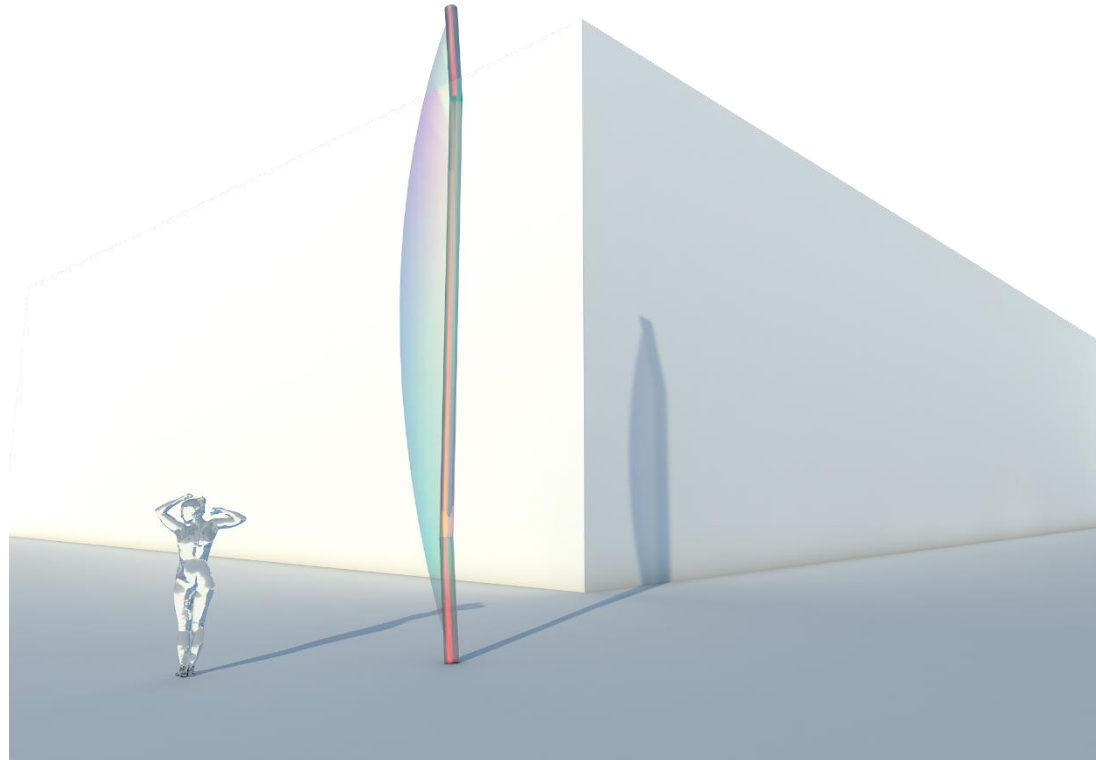
