William (Bill) Day resided here at one time per interview with Edna Strickland Burgess. This was probably in the 1910s as the 1910 Census shows he resided on the property. The More family was here in 1940s. The house is directly west of Pure Taqueria Restaurant. Summary list shows house was built in 1850 that came from Fulton County tax records.

e. 61 Roswell St. Skeleton-Teasley House

Built in 1856. Style: Greek Revival. Thought to be the oldest house in Alpharetta. Built for Dr. Skelton. His daughter and son-in-law John Teasley inherited the home upon Dr. Skelton's death. John Teasley was a major land speculator who was likely the richest man in town in his day.
