- Mr. Carson Young, owner of Yumbii Atwater, LLC and residing at 2751 Dover Road, Atlanta, GA 30327, was on the call. His wife, Katy, was also on the call to help interpret as Mr. Young is legally hearing-impaired.
- Mrs. Young described the business as a fast & casual, family-friendly restaurant that originally started out as a food truck business. The food is a blend of Asian-Mexican fusion. They have 4 locations throughout the metropolitan area and one more opening soon.

- Mrs. Young indicated the restaurant opened in early-April and they currently have 8 employees.
- Mrs. Young advised that all employees taking orders, handling, or pouring alcohol will have a pouring permit. The employees are TIPS trained and go through a thorough internal training when hired.
- Mr. O'Donnell addressed the applicant's question as to having a locked beer cooler that will be unlocked by an employee holding a valid pouring permit when an alcoholic beverage is purchased.
- Ms. Shapiro reminded the applicant that once the local license is issued, a state license will need to be obtained before they can begin serving alcohol.
- Officer O'Donnell confirmed that City staff has reviewed the application and that it meets all the City's requirements for an alcohol license. Ms. Shapiro recommended the application be approved and advised the applicant that a representative will need to appear in person at the Alpharetta City Council meeting on Monday, April 24, 2023, at 6:30 pm in case Mayor or Council have any questions.
