- A The comes from the Cultural Arts Master Plan.

Q What happened with the parks that were going to be open in strategic areas? (Foster)

A We are making great strides in that, 2 opening in May-Mid Broadwell and Waters Road. I will send an email to all of you with the ribbon cuttings and openings scheduled. (Rodgers)

Q Could you anticipate more revenue by expanding the ceramics studio? (Smeal)

A Yes, they are currently fundraising to purchase their own equipment. (Manning)

Q Is this in addition to the budget for next year? Knowing that art funding is not a high priority are you willing to rank them? (Genet)

A I am prepared to make them aware of the categories. (Manning)

A We don't anticipate a lot of pushback, it has been very well vetted by the staff. Also, I think Arts is a priority in Alpharetta. (Rodgers)

C Extension of the ceramics lab is an excellent idea. (Foster)

A The budget comes out in June and run from July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025. (Rodgers)

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

ITEM DESCRIPTION:

Background

Iveybrooke Townhomes has been approved to develop an 85 Townhome community in the City of Alpharetta/Community Development/North Point Overlay/Eco District. In the conditions from the Planning Commission and Design & Review Board, The Providence Group is required to have a "monument" onsite and will have a metal artist create a Frog sculpture.

Public Art Review Committee Recommendation

The Public Art Review Committee held the review on June 10, 2024, and recommended to approve the application with minor modifications. The Public Art Review Committee approved the application with minor modifications to provide additional renderings to clarify the scale of the piece with the added base. No further review required from the Public Art Review Committee.

Comments & Recommendations:

1. Jackson started by noting this artist was selected based off the Ecco District building guidelines, as he uses reclaimed materials and builds sustainable and weather appropriate pieces.
2. The piece will be seen from Davis Drive and face Davis Drive sidewalk. Entrants to Top Golf will also be able to see it.
3. Before the committee brought up the height concerns (5'4"), Jackson mentioned it was decided to place the piece on an 18" base to elevate it. The committee liked this addition. However, they mentioned Jackson to possibly provide a rendering of the base and how it would blend in with the architecture of the community.
4. Furthermore, if they could provide a scale rendering of the base and piece, it would help the Commission visualize the final version.

Public Art Review Committee Recommendations:

Approved with Minor Modifications. Provide any additional renderings to clarify the scale of the piece with the added base. No further review required from the Public Art Committee.

Maintenance Plan for Iveybrooke Eco-District Art Piece

Art Piece and Site

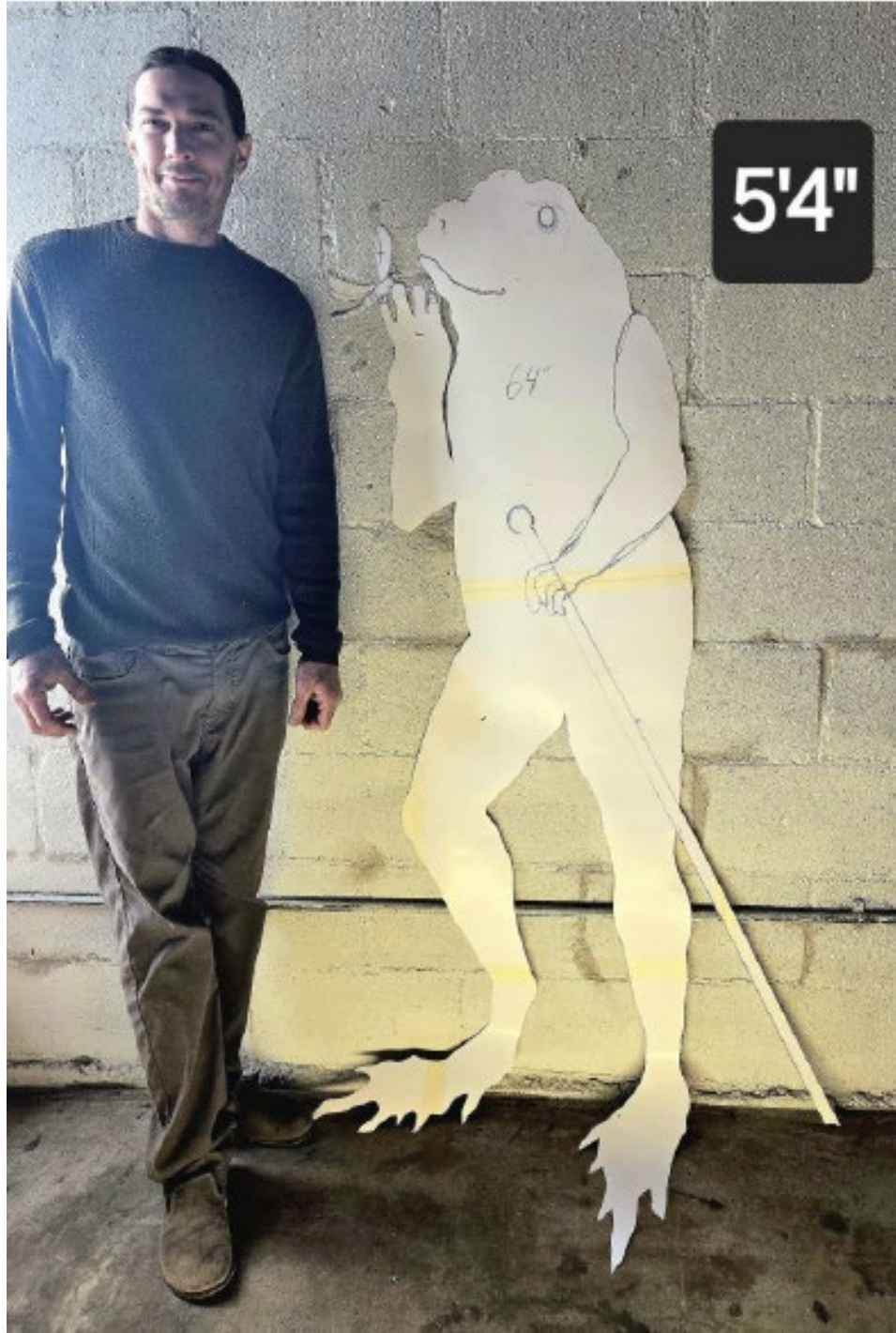
This site of the community and art location is part of the City's Eco District off of Davis Dr. This sculpture embodies the essence of eclectic industrial style through its connection of organic and industrial elements. Designed and crafted by artist, Jacob Novinger, the standing frog symbolizes nature, while the dragonfly and walking stick add whimsy and intrigue. A combination of which represents the City's growth and movement back to forest and nature first place of living. Crafted from various sizes of steel tubing and bar; it boasts sturdy industrial construction. The rusty oxidized metal look, achieved through 16-gauge steel sheeting and automotive clear coat, evokes an aged, weathered charm showcases the eclectic industrial aesthetics of the Eco District. The sculpture is estimated to be 64" in height. Examples of the finished material are provided in accompanying pictures. The location of the art piece will be at the corner of the property in front planted landscape with a natural tree save area behind it.

Installation and Maintenance

The art will be purchased by The Providence Group, the owner, who is also the developer/builder. It will be installed by the owner at the instruction of the artist (Jacob Novinger) to ensure proper installation. Bolts anchored into concrete footers along with nuts will hold the art piece in place atop an 18" raised platform. The art will be maintained by the owner until such a time that the Iveybrooke homeowners' association is operational. Once the HOA is established and operating the art, including the landscaping, will be maintained by the Iveybrooke community HOA. Maintenance of the art will be a part of the HOA's covenants.

Jacob Novinger

Jacob Novinger is a custom metal artist out of Bliss, Idaho. Novinger is a skilled artist who uses recycled materials, to revitalize them to create new works of art. Turning one person's discarded material into long lasting art for everyone to enjoy. Novinger specializes in wildlife pieces as well as abstract creations

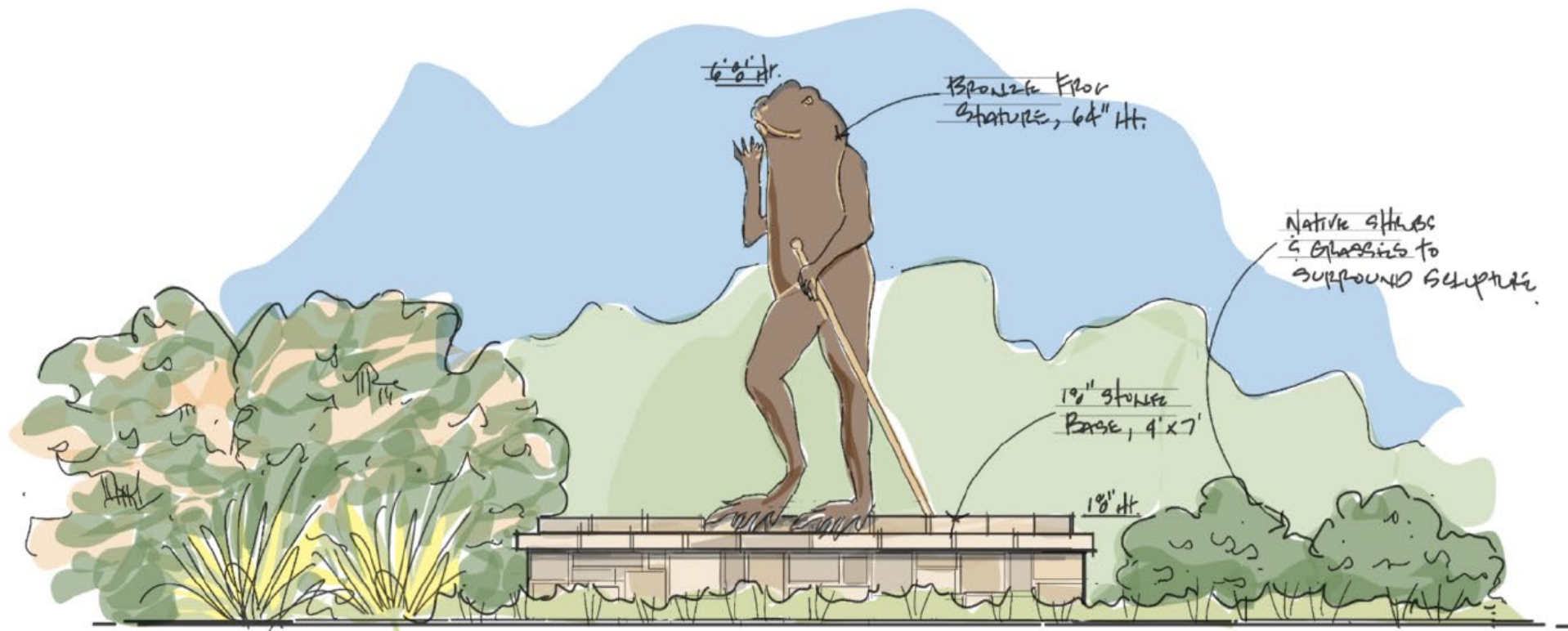

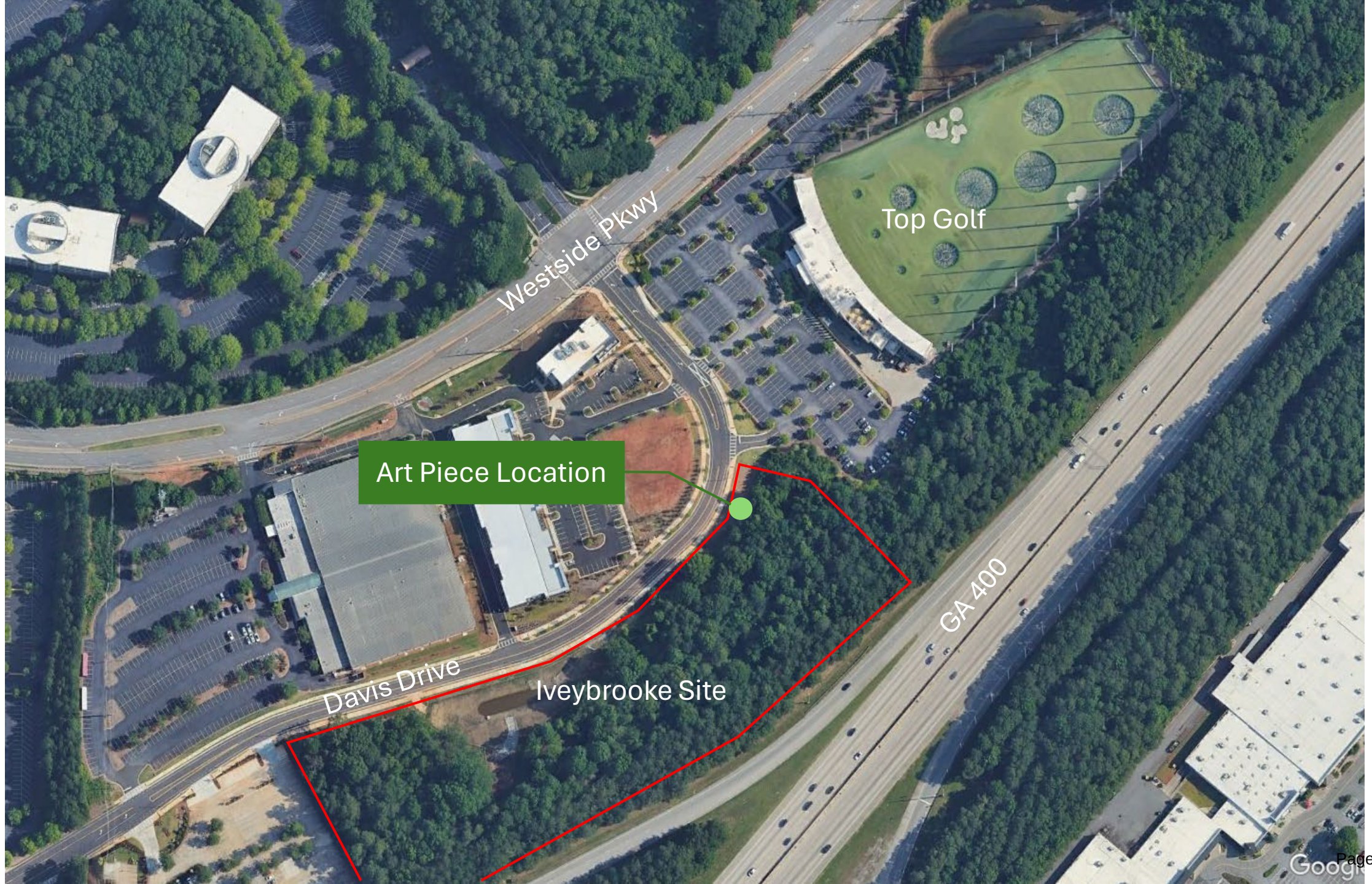

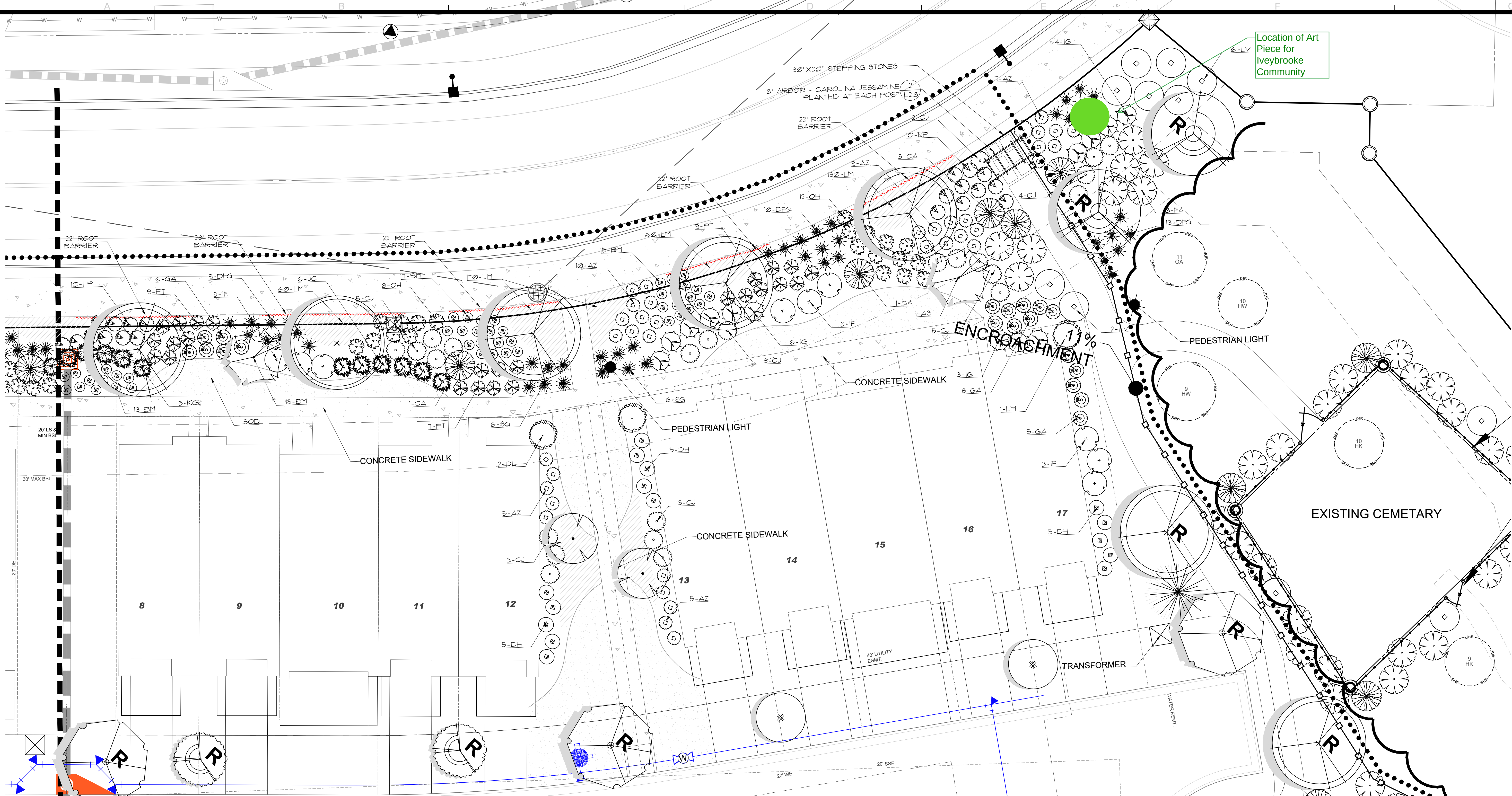


Elevation of sculpture on raised platform with surrounding landscaping

ALPHARETTA LANDSCAPE NOTES

- If there are inconsistencies between any items on these plans the more strict interpretation of those requirements shall be followed. Please contact the City Arborist for any interpretation.
- Prior to the tree save fence inspection provide the City Arborist with proof of pre-payment of the required tree care plan to a reputable tree care company.
- Tree save fence and signage for entire site must be installed, inspected and approved prior to installation of erosion control measures. No land disturbance or demolition is allowed before this inspection and approval has occurred.
- The CRZ of Specimen Trees plus all buffers shall be protected with wire-back tree save fencing with metal support posts or chain link and Tree Save signage.
- Installation of the tree save fence will involve no trenching.
- All existing trees identified for preservation or found within tree save areas must be fully protected during all phases of this project.
- Additional trees along the limits of disturbance with encroachment into the SRP and deemed structurally unsafe by the City Arborist or the Project Arborist may be required to be removed prior to CO.
- All roots encountered 1/2" or greater during grading or excavating operations shall be clean cut under the direction of an ISA Certified Arborist.
- Any limbs overhanging the LOD that may be ripped, torn, or damaged during construction SHALL be properly pruned under the direction of an ISA Certified Arborist.
- It is the owner's responsibility to maintain the vegetation and remove trash and debris around the perimeter of the project, even if within the public ROW, in accordance with the City of Alpharetta Property Maintenance Codes.
- All approved revisions to the location of the tree save fence need to be coordinated with the land disturbance inspector prior to relocation.

Maintenance Plan for Park Walke Art Piece

Art Piece and Site

Thompson Street in the last 8 years has undergone a major transformation. The streetscape once dominated by small unassuming buildings has blossomed into a picturesque landscape of high-quality craftsman homes, while also mixing in new public destination uses such as the Alpha Loop and Thompson Street Park. This is a direct parallel to the life cycle of the butterfly. A once overlooked caterpillar, with time and energy develops into a beloved beautiful butterfly. The proposed sculpture is of a monarch butterfly sitting atop of a coneflower, which are native to Georgia and USDA gardening zone 7 that Alpharetta lies within. This piece is the representation of the transformation of Thompson Street.

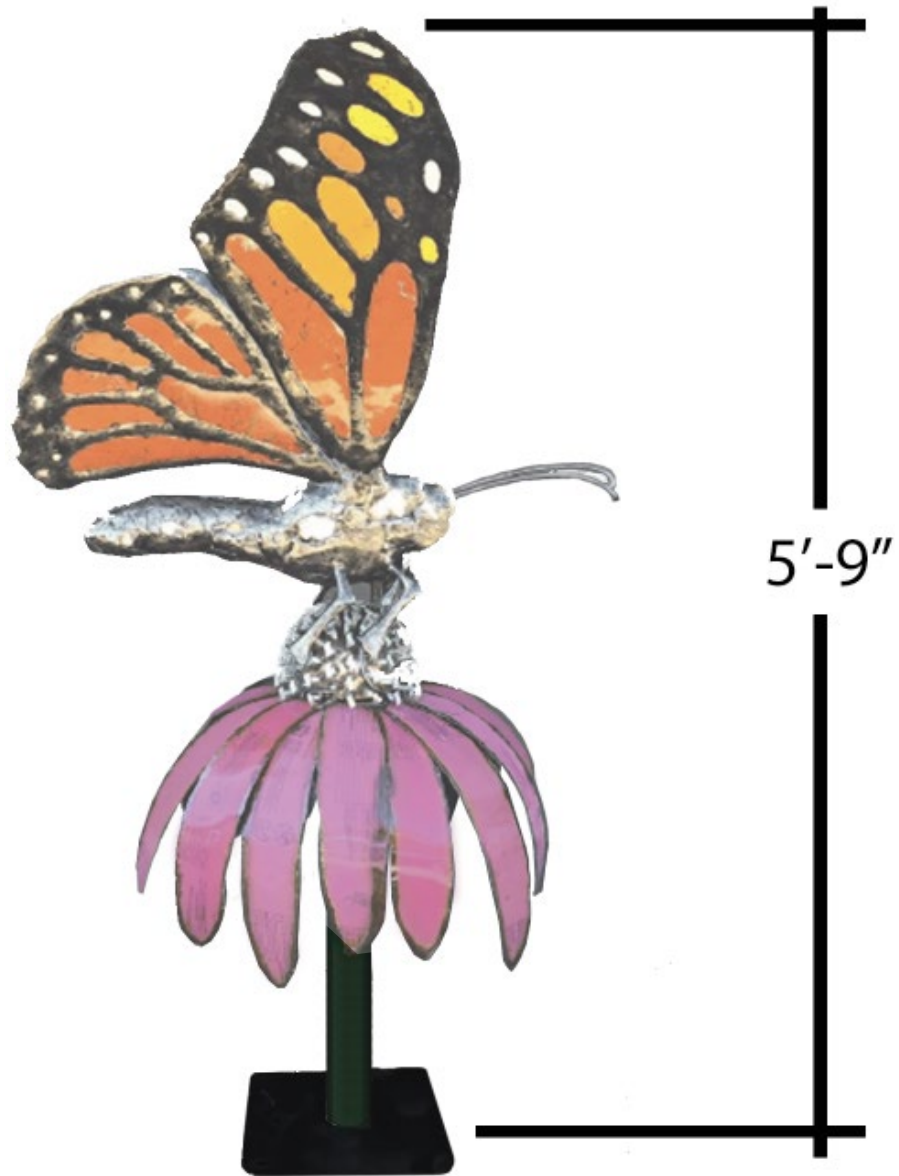
The site for the sculpture is the front corner of the Thompson Street Flats entrance drive. An existing concrete pad, poured by the developer will be utilized to place the sculpture. The piece will be hand crafted from reclaimed steel and painted then finished with 2 coats of automotive clear coating. The sculpture is a reinterpretation of the accompanying images. It is estimated to be 66" to 69" in height. The final piece will have custom embellishments that vary from the pictures based on the reclaimed material found. It will stand approximately a foot taller by extending the length of flower's stem. Also, the flower will be purple to match the native purple coneflowers of Georgia.

Installation and Maintenance

The art will be purchased by The Providence Group, who is also the developer/builder of the adjacent Park Walke community. It will be installed by The Providence Group at the instruction of the artist (Jacob Novinger) to ensure proper installation. Bolts anchored into the existing concrete pad along with nuts will hold the art piece in place. The art will be maintained by the Thompson Street Flats HOA.

Jacob Novinger

Jacob Novinger is a custom metal artist out of Bliss, Idaho. Novinger is a skilled artist who uses recycled materials, to revitalize them to create new works of art. Turning one person's discarded material into long lasting art for everyone to enjoy. Novinger specializes in wildlife pieces as well as abstract creations

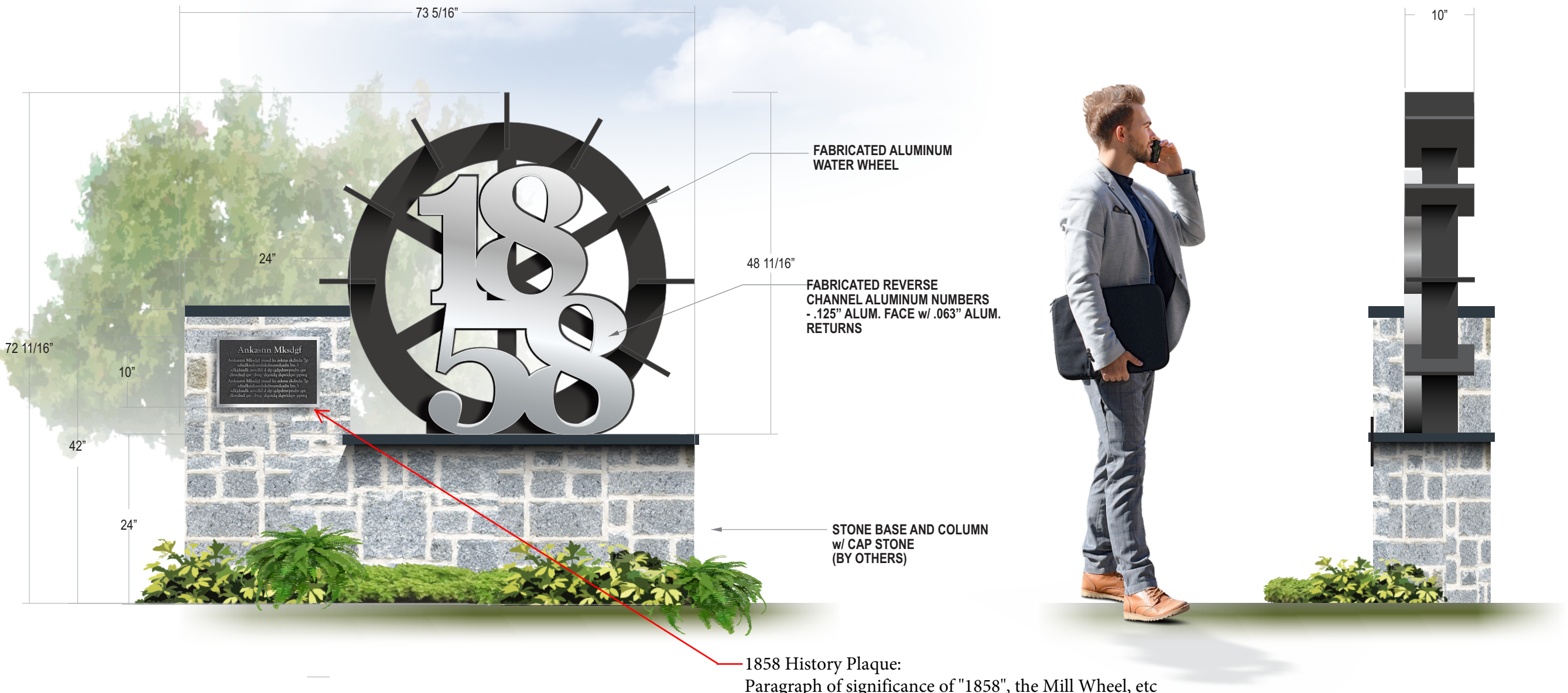

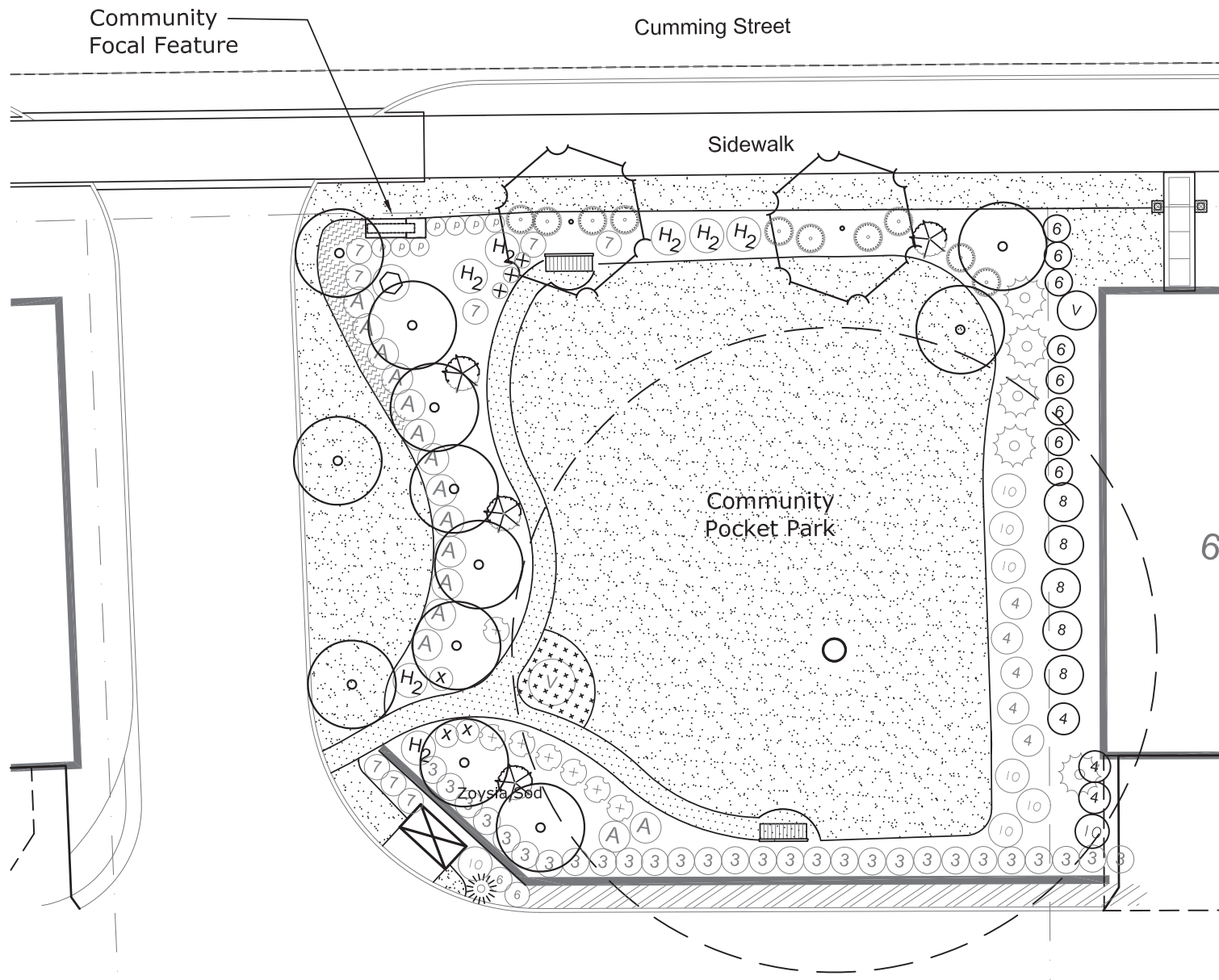

The Huxton Group is pleased to be working with our client and the City of Alpharetta on this exciting piece.

This historical monument piece is custom fabricated with combinations of aluminum sheeting and tubing, and secured in the ground through the stone base via a steel tube. All parts to be welded with no obvious exposed fasteners or seams. The paint finish is a Mathews automotive finish with satin clear.

We recommend an annual cleaning as follows:

Annual cleaning may be done using a mild detergent with a soft cloth or sponge and hose or bucket of water. DO NOT PRESSURE WASH.

Avoid direct spray from adjacent sprinkler systems as many water systems contain chlorine and will result in fading, bleaching or chalking of the paint finish.

Advise landscape maintenance crews to avoid contact with chemicals and fertilizers. These will erode the paint finish and result in fading, bleaching or chalking of the paint finish.

NEVER USE STRONG CHEMICALS, ABRASIVES, AMONIA BASED CLEANERS, ABRASIVE PADS OR OTHER CLEANING SOLUTIONS as damage to the protective coating will result.

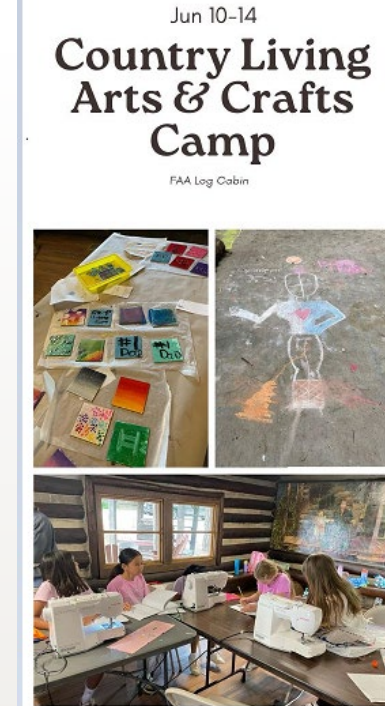

Allura plays on the colors of the surrounding environment. As the metallic stainless steel reflects the hues of the landscape, the neon ribbon flows to add motion for the viewers eye to follow, creating a medley of movement and color.

This sculpture pays homage to the revival of the green revelation in travel. The only sounds heard by the bikers are the sounds of wind and their innermost thoughts. The viewer can stand back and look at this sculpture and remember the joy of bicycling and be inspired to return to a quieter time.

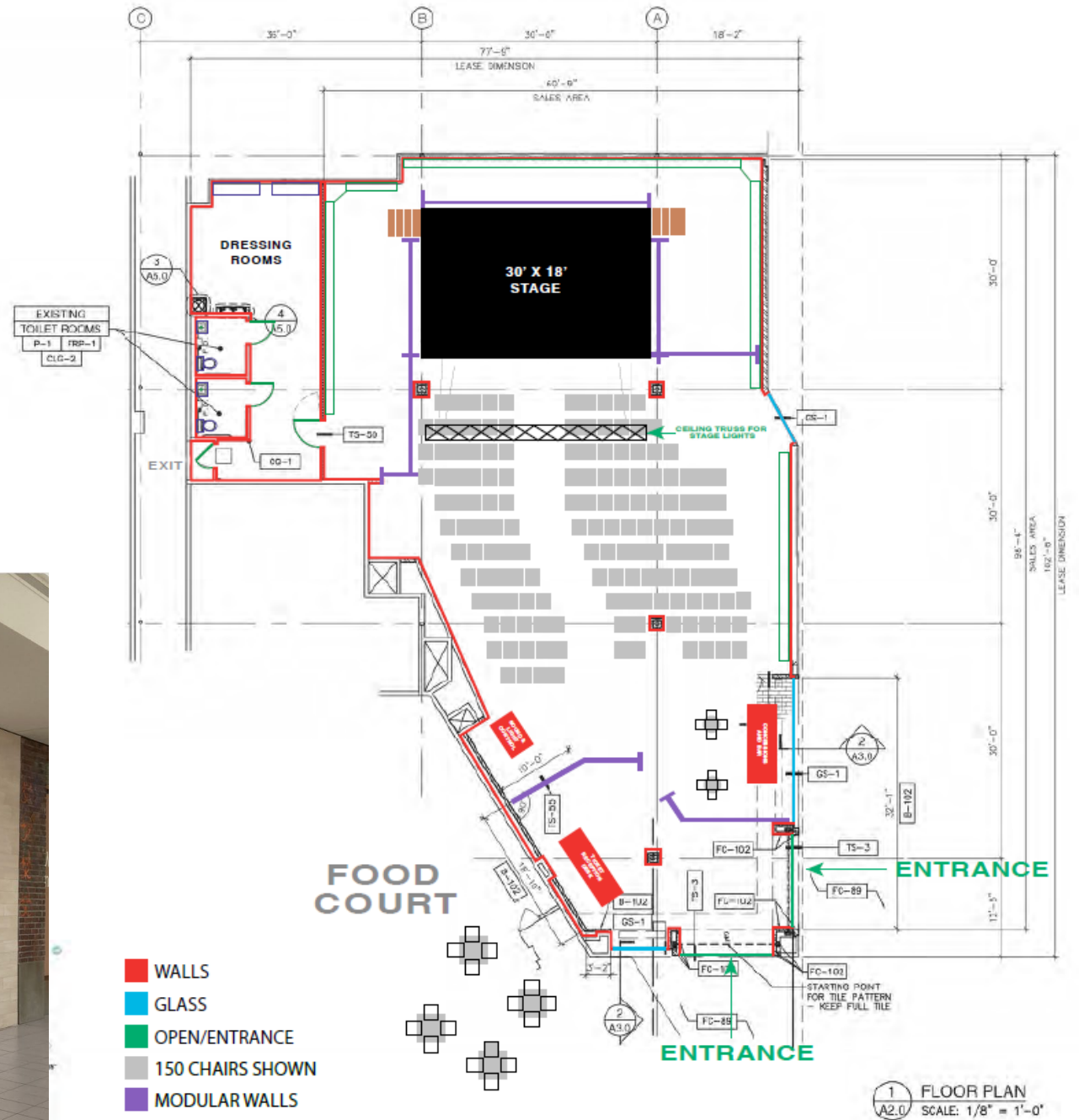

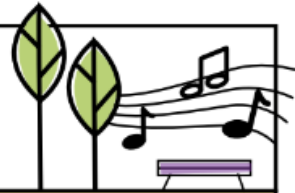
