RECREATION COMMISSION Q&A:

RE: Webb Bridge Park Turf

Q Turf project, sewer, then what? (Piedrahita)

A They are planning to start after the Ambush Soccer season is over. Construction will take place during the winter months. (Kirby)

RE: Greenway

Q I know E-Bikes are not allowed on the Greenway, what about motorized scooters? (Piedrahita)

A Motorized scooters are not E-Bikes, so it cannot be enforced. (Kirby)

RE: Webb Bridge Park

Q Are benches planned for Webb Zone? (Kaighin)

A The Phase has enhancements to Webb Zone including turf where the sandy area currently is located, increase the condition and placement of the picnic tables. (Kirby)

Q Could the new donated plaque benches be installed? (Kaighin)

A We are not opposed to that style of bench. (Kirby)

Q Webb Zone is awesome, only thing that is strange is that all the playground equipment has places for cell phones, why? (Piedrahita)

A We probably did not notice that when we purchased the equipment. (Kirby)

Q You are going to City Council for the turf, do you currently have a bid? (Rand)

A Yes, we do. (Kirby)

Q Wayfinders are great, what about exiting signage? (Saha)

A I will need to follow up with the company on that signage. (Kirby)

RE: Cameras

Q Cameras in the parks, when? (Rand)

A Yes, we are currently working with Public Safety to get this going. (Kirby)

b. DIRECTOR

i. Director's Report – July 2024

- Morgan Rogers, Director for Recreation, Parks & Cultural Services Department came forward to speak.
 - Review the highlights for the Fiscal Year 2024 for the Recreation, Parks & Cultural Services
 - Union Hill Park Update – City Council tabled the discussion of the Parking Redesign at the June 24, 2024 meeting. There was no indication from the City that a playground was to be installed prior to the bond.
 - Wacky World Update – Is not moving forward at this time, the City is looking to hire a construction manager to encompass all the Wills Park projects. The Community Build is not going to happen in October.

Update on Union Hill Park:

- Vice Chairman Saha brought six questions from a local resident.
 - Target event size with this proposed additional parking spots? Director Rogers answered approximately 400 people.
 - How many additional rental anticipated? Do you plan to increase the rental rate? Director Rogers stated that he did not know for sure but the City is hopeful for 20-25 additional events, including camps. The City is planning to increase the rental rate once construction is completed regardless of what is decided with the park.

- When does the parks bond money need to be spent or encumbered by? 2026? Assistant City Administrator Drinkard that we have a 3-5 year window, the Feds do not want you to stock pile the money to earn interest. The goal is to have it encumbered by 2026. The City is trying to avoid not spending it.
- Have you considered going to the Windward Park businesses to seeing about a grant? Director Rodgers stated that the City has not considered that but it is an option.
- Looking at the design, in my opinion, the most costly thing was moving the skate park. Is there a better value design that does not have a costly move? Director Rodgers stated that we have not because Mayor and Council has not given the green light to move forward with any of the designs.
- Director Rodgers stated that the skate park is too loud and needs to be moved further from the covered venue. Redesign would have to happen and the concrete would still need to be moved.
- Commissioner Piedrahita stated that the verbiage around the upgrade of Union Hill Park is vague. She also asked if ample parking really an upgrade? Monetizing the space? Can renters keep the profit? Who is doing that today? Director Rodgers stated that Home By Dark, Grillfest, and Shamrockin' for the Cure have all done that in the past. Commissioner Piedrahita continued to ask are there ticketed events at other parks? Director Rodgers stated that currently no one is doing that, the Rotary Club raises money for non-profits. Manager Casey stated that the Rodeo does that and Commissioner Slavik stated that the Farmers Market keeps their profits.

Wacky World Update:

- Commissioner Piedrahita asked if the Construction Manager plans to work with the Community Build? Director Rodgers stated the plan is to do the Community Build with them.
- Commissioner Rand asked if Director Rodgers was being vague about Wacky World? Director Rodgers stated that he was not, there are a lot of moving parts and a lot of unknowns at this time. Assistant City Administrator Drinkard stated that the City is looking to approach this different than anything they have done before. By doing it all under one project, there are advantages. We cannot speak confidently at this time regarding the build. The City does not have a plan to alter Wacky World at all, the only change is the change in timeline. The current City Hall building is the closest thing the City has done to this.

VI. RECREATION COMMISSIONER REPORTS

- Commissioner Piedrahita thanked Morgan for is leadership. Super grateful for him.
- Commission Piedrahita wanted to know the capacity of The Grove pavilion. Director Rogers stated approximately 40-50 people.
- Commissioner Rand wanted to know where Amanda was tonight. Director Rogers stated on vacation.

- Commissioner Saha stated that he would love to see the City have the capability to have a calendar that could download onto a personal calendar. Christine Young stated that we would need to look into that item. Assistant City Administrator Drinkard stated that he would bring that up with the build of the new City website and calendar.

VII. PUBLIC COMMENT

- None.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT

- ❖ Vice Chairman Saha called for a motion to adjourn the meeting.
 - Commissioner Rand made a motion to adjourn.
 - Commissioner Slavik seconded the motion.
- ❖ The motion was approved unanimously (6-0).
