IV. ASSOCIATION PRESENTATION

- a. Ambush Soccer – Doug Yearwood presented great information regarding Ambush Soccer here in Alpharetta. They were voted best sports program by Appen Media. He stated that they changed their entire operating system providing a new website and a lot of app functionality. He also stated that player safety is extremely important to their program. He brought up some statistics regarding the program, Fall recreation soccer had approximately 803 sign ups and the Fall Academy had approximately 851 sign ups. The success stems from the use of Innovation Academy field and the other 4 fields in Alpharetta. The recreation portion of the program is at approximately 91% Alpharetta residency and the Academy has approximately 56% Alpharetta residency. He stated that they offer 6 camps each year with over 800 players. They started a 3 vs 3 tournament this year and had 78 teams between 2 tournaments. The program has been pretty self-sufficient, he stated that they have not asked the City for much. The only item that is currently needed is a couple ice machines at the parks. The new Webb Bridge turf field will be a game changer for the Ambush Program.

A We have to play all over North Fulton to make sure we are on dry fields. (Yearwood)

Q Who leads the camps? (Kaighin)

A Our Academy and staff of Coaches. (Yearwood)

A Eristavi is still the head coach, we are fortunate with our coaching staff. (Yearwood)

A USA Soccer is on a different planet than youth soccer. (Yearwood)

A Changed it to calendar year now we are planning to change it back to the birthdate. (Yearwood)

Q Thank you so much for what you do for the City. Will the turf hurt the new season? (Piedrahita)

A Recreation will end before the turf starts. Academy will be affected but not for long. (Yearwood)

Q Who can participate in the 3 vs 3 tournaments? (Mitchell)

A Anybody can play in the that tournament. (Yearwood)

- Greenhouse construction - The General Contractor has been chosen and construction will begin later this month.
- Invasive species removal will begin this month in the wooded area of Old Rucker Park. The privet, kudzu, ivy and other invasive plants will be removed by ReForestATL and they will maintain the park to keep the invasives from coming back. Old Rucker Park will be a test for this approach, and once proven successful we will explore the possibility of doing similar work in other parks.
- We are moving forward with the comprehensive design documentation and construction administration vendor for the upcoming renovations of the facility at Old Rucker Park. The vendor has been chosen, and the work to develop a plan for the facility will begin later this month.
- We started monthly seed packing volunteer days at the Alpharetta and Milton library branches, enabling us to have a constant supply to seed packs to keep the libraries stocked with seasonal seeds. The library is recruiting the volunteers, and we host the event.

- NRPA Off Site Institute – three staff members are attending the NRPA Conference. OSI Event where we partnered with Johns Creek and Roswell to do a Big Creek Greenway tour on E-bikes. There were 47 participants and we met with Daniel Dominique and Thomas Nolf along the way to talk about the manhole paintings.
- YAA Association kicked off the Fall Season
- Scarecrows are ready for viewing around town and throughout Wills Park.
- Youth basketball is ready to start the season with practices beginning the week of November 4th and games beginning December 7th.

iv. Park Services Division Monthly Report (Excluding Wills Park) – October 2024

- Eric Milley, Park Services Division Manager for the Recreation, Parks & Cultural Services Department was not in attendance, his presentation is available in the packet online.

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS:

- We have completed the hard asphalt connection from Union Hill Greenway trail head to McGinnis Ferry/Forsyth Greenway trail connection.
- We have completed the center line striping all along the Alpharetta portion of the Greenway trail.
- We continue to remove declining trees in all parks and clear out underbrush along the trails to open areas of limited visibility such as corners and intersections.
- We are in the process of getting proposals to replace some of the broken concrete panels behind City Hall in Brooke Street Park.
- The big metal bridges along the main Greenway Trail have been pressure washed.
- We continue to clean up storm debris in all parks and trails from hurricane Helene.
- The seasonal plantings in all planters and medians will be complete by the end of October.

- Developing new maintenance plans and practices for the Alpha Loop to include watering and overseeding.

v. **Park Services Division Monthly Report (Wills Park & Equestrian Center) – October 2024**

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS:

- Staff has done a great job with removal of fallen trees and storm debris from hurricane Helene.
- We have added sod along Old Milton Parkway as well as enhanced the entrance by the pool with new landscaping.
- New signs with stone were added at the Athletic field entrances. This completes the sign initiative at Wills Park. The Equestrian Center signage will be added later.
- Equestrian events have been well attended. We will have a full show schedule moving into the fall season.

b. **DIRECTOR**

i. **Director's Report – October 2024**

- Morgan Rodgers, Director for the Recreation, Parks & Cultural Services Department came forward to present the item.
- Director Rodgers gave an update on the OSI Event. The group started in Roswell, went through Alpharetta and onto to Forsyth and then returned.
- Director Rodgers stated that the NRPA being in town is a very big deal and they took 11 staff members to the Exhibit Hall for the day.
- Director Rodgers stated that the City officially received the LWCF money for the North Park light poles and lighting.

- Director Rodgers gave a Bond Update regarding the Webb Bridge Park turf, he stated that everything was on track to start in November
- Director Rodger stated that the Recreation, Parks & Cultural Services Department is going to start updating the Master Plan for the entire department over the course of the next few months. This will be done inhouse and there will be some online surveys going out.

A Everything looked the same, underwhelming. Lots of turf, a lot of lighting businesses. The coolest vendor was a Drone Show vendor. (Rodgers)

Q It was opening weekend for AYSA and the concession stand closed super early. Is that the City or AYSA? (Slavik)

A We will contact AYSA about that. (Rodgers)

Q Is the medaling with NRPA no longer a thing? (Rand)

A We have lots going on right now and it is time consuming. We currently do not have the time. (Rodgers)

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

ITEM DESCRIPTION:

Monthly Highlights:

- Invasive species removal is underway and we are making great progress. Please see the attached before and after photos from this month's progress at Old Rucker Park. This is an ongoing project, and we will be working with ReForest ATL every month, plus hosting "weed wrangle" volunteer events to get the invasive plants out of the park.
- The new greenhouse at Old Rucker Farm will be built this month. We are very grateful to the ABA for their generous donation of a new, 24' by 36' greenhouse, and we look forward to all the classes, events, and plants that will soon be inside the new space.
- We were invited to pick up pumpkins and gourds from the Atlanta Botanical Gardens again this year when their autumn display came down, and we focused on varieties that we can center November and December classes around. With the donated gourds, we plan to host one pumpkin-succulent centerpiece class in November, and one pumpkin-greenery centerpiece class in December. These two classes have the potential to generate over \$1,200.00 in revenue, and our supply costs are zero, thanks to the generosity of the Atlanta Botanical Gardens!
- Our first Scout Day took place this month, and we had over 80 registered Daisy, Brownie, and Junior Girl Scouts, with environmental and agricultural education activities for each level and badges to earn. Please see the attached photos. This event was hosted at Old Rucker Farm, and the stations were set up as "self-serve". The Scout leaders were given instructions for each activity, and then they lead the activity for their troop. There were eight tables set up around the farm with educational activities, plus the new Smith Family Trail was used for additional educational learning.

Monthly Initiatives:

- Garden plots are up for renewal starting November 4th for existing plot holders, and November 11th for new people. Existing plot holders have historically had one week to renew before their plots are open to the general public.

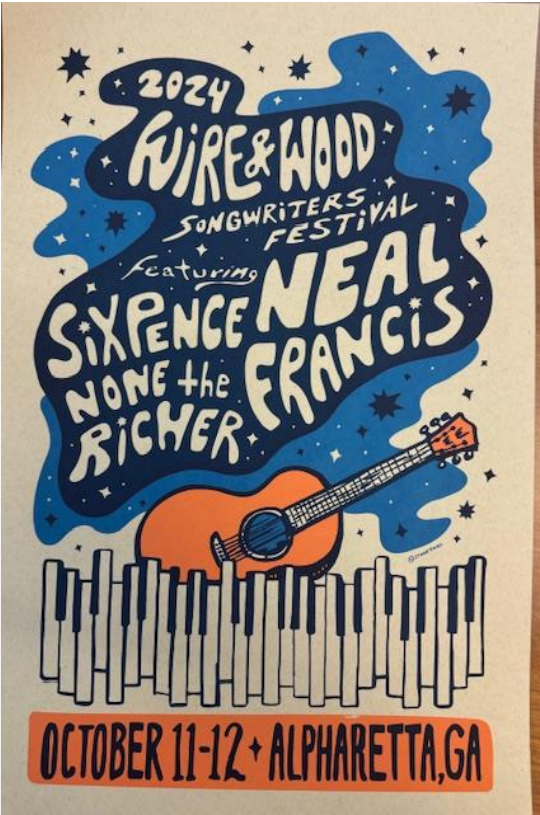
